

ATTENTION EXHIBITORS (Please read carefully)

All entries must be pre-entered. Once placed in the computer, entries cannot be changed. Substitutions cannot be made, i.e. if you enter a Cherry Pie, you cannot bring an Apple Pie as a substitute. If there are any questions that a certain item will be ready at fair time, pre-enter it anyway.

ALL ENTRIES MUST BE FILLED OUT COMPLETELY.

If not, they will be returned. NO animal or exhibit may be removed from the Fairgrounds prior to 9:00 PM Saturday, September 3, 2022. Removal prior to that time will result in loss of ALL Premiums.

NOTICE: The Wattsburg Agricultural Society Inc. d/b/a Erie County Fair at Wattsburg assumes no responsibility in case of loss or damage to stock or other exhibits from any cause, and upon this condition only, are entries received. The Fair will not assume any liability for personal injury sustained either by exhibitors, helpers, visitors or guests. All persons renting privileges on the grounds and all exhibitors of livestock, machinery, etc. must so conduct their business or exhibit so that the public will not be liable to injury. In case anyone is injured, the renter or exhibitor shall assume all responsibility thereafter, and shall indemnify the Erie County Fair at Wattsburg for any and all expenses occurred by such an accident or injury.

All protests must be made in writing and must state plainly the complaint, and must be delivered to the Secretary within six (6) hours after the cause of the protest, with a deposit of \$5.00, which will be forfeited to the Fair if the protest is not sustained. Positively no premiums will be given on articles not listed in premium list.

Directions: The office is located on the fairgrounds, Routes 8 & 89, Wattsburg, PA. From Rt. 6 to Rt. 89 to Wattsburg. From I-86 to Rt. 89 to Wattsburg. From I-90 to Rt. 8 to Wattsburg. The office hours, telephone and fax numbers, as well as the web site and email are listed above. Your entry forms are due 2 weeks prior to the fair. Your entries will be accepted in the specified departments from 12 noon to 6:00 PM on Sunday, August 28, 2022 and 9AM to noon on Monday, August 29, 2022.

The Official Erie County Fair

At Wattsburg Premium Guide

GENERAL RULES

The State Premium Book has been arranged so that Fairs may incorporate all or parts of it in their individual Fair Premium Books. All Fairs who receive Fair Program Grants shall conform with this book when preparing their Premium Books. This means you shall follow the position of a Department as shown. You need not show any Departments, Divisions, Sections or Classes for which you do not want Exhibits. Every exhibit accepted for premium must be given an entry tag, which must be properly marked to show the Name of the Exhibit. In the case of live stock, breed name must be shown on cards large enough so that the breed name can be readily identified by the viewers. If the livestock is grouped together according to breed, one large sign to designate the group will be satisfactory. The ribbons or rosettes must be placed on the stall or pen of the individual winners for the duration of the Fair or show. In the case of poultry, entry tags showing species must be plainly exhibited on each cage, and winning stickers must appear on such entry tags showing winners. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in forfeiture of premiums. It will be the duty of the Fair or show officials to enforce this regulation. We want each Fair to encourage exhibitors in each class; however, in some departments, facilities may limit the number of entries. Accordingly, in some classes or divisions, you may limit the number of entries per exhibitor in each class.

JUDGING RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All exhibitors agree to be bound by the rules and regulations of The Erie County Fair at Wattsburg.
2. The Fair management reserves the right to amend or add to these guidelines as its judgment may determine.
3. Reasonable care will be taken to protect all exhibits on display from all injury and damage, but The Erie County Fair at Wattsburg, PA is not in any way to be held responsible for accidents, loss or damage by water, fire, theft or otherwise, whatever may be the cause or extent of the damage or loss.
4. All entries must have been grown, produced, or made since the last Fair, by the person whose name appears on the tag as exhibitor. If entries are to be limited to residents of the County, or to a specified area, this must be stated in the Fair's Premium Book or tabloid under the Rules Section. Any exhibitor may be required to prove ability to reproduce entry in any department in the presence of a qualified person.
5. Superintendents reserve the right to bar from competition any entry of inferior quality and those not possessing sufficient merit to warrant recognition. The Fair reserves the right to remove any exhibit not worthy of viewing by the public.
6. Food products cannot be made with any substance that causes them to become poisonous and unfit to be used for consumption. Any such incidents must be reported to the Pennsylvania Agricultural Fair Program for further review.
7. No exhibit may be removed at any time before the close of the Fair, except by consent of the management of the Fair.
8. Where award ribbons are stolen or destroyed, the exhibitor may receive a duplicate at the close of the Fair or show which shall be supplied by the Fair, free of charge.
9. All livestock offered for premiums must have been the property of the owners for thirty (30) days or longer. Health papers are to be issued in the name of the exhibitor.
10. The market animals should be weighed on the same set of scales under a qualified weight master, and the direction of the Fair.
11. Over fitting of cattle is discouraged. any artificial means used to change the form or shape of an animal will disqualify it from competition.
12. When on exhibition in the ring, each animal must be under halter and in charge of owner or employee. The Fair will have stand-by attendants available during the youth judging or showing; persons designated if there is trouble with the animals.
13. Joint ownership is considered to be as one owner in accordance with registration papers.
14. Recognizing the fact that it is not possible to list every desirable or worthwhile class in each section of each department, and that fashion and fad, particularly in the areas of Needlecraft, Domestic Art and Fine Art, may change the norm for which it is intended, it is advised that each Fair shall add or delete classes in which they perceive to be in their own best interest. Such changes shall not in any way jeopardize the Premium reimbursement up to the maximum set forth in each Section of each Department.
15. It is permissible for each fair to establish Supreme Champion Classes.
16. Entries will be made according to classification.
17. Premiums, as listed, may be given for meritorious exhibits. In cases where there is no competition, Judges may give an award such as they deem the exhibit is worthy to receive. Same rule applies where there are fewer entries in any class than the number of premiums offered. the Judges may, at their discretion, award a ribbon or rosette.
18. The Fair reserves the right to determine how many entries they will accept from an exhibitor in the same class, or, in the case of livestock, the same breed, and poultry, the same species.
19. The decision of the judges shall be final in all cases, except where mistakes, fraud, misrepresentation or collusion, not discovered at the time of the award, is proved. In such cases, the superintendent, manager or secretary of the Fair or show, or such referee as he/she may appoint, may make the decision. The case may be appealed to the Fair management or Show Commission, from whose decision there can be no appeal. It is suggested that each Fair have a committee of three board members designated prior to fair time for this purpose. There will be no judging or prize awarded on the Danish System.
20. All protests regarding the judging must be made in writing and must plainly state the cause of the complaint or appeal. Such protests must be filed at the Fair Office within 24 hours of the occurrence.
21. It shall be the responsibility of the exhibitor to properly name the article or breed of livestock he/she is entering, any exhibit improperly entered will be disqualified to receive a premium, but the judges will make the correct name on the entry tag for the benefit of the owner so the same mistake in entering need not be made the second time.
22. Judging is viewed as an educational process and the public is encouraged to view the judging event. Any exhibitor interfering with the Judges while making awards shall forfeit any premium to which he/she would otherwise have been entitled. Each Fair is to implement this effort, based on available space.
23. Should any animal awarded a prize be disqualified, the animals gaining the lower prizes shall move into the next higher position, if in the opinion of the judges the animals are worthy of such prizes.
24. The Erie County Fair at Wattsburg reserves the right to withhold Premiums awarded in any case in which it shall appear that the regulations have not been complied with or that fraud or deception has been practiced or attempted, and at the Superintendent's discretion, be excused from the ground and/or be barred from future competition at this show.
25. Department superintendents may enter exhibits in their own departments, but neither they nor any other exhibitor may communicate with the Judges during the time of determining the awards, except to answer questions proposed by the Judges.

It is permissible to charge an entry fee.



Animal Health Rules

Erie County Fair at Wattsburg animal health rules are to be followed in all animal departments and contests. Appropriate documentation of necessary immunizations must be presented upon arrival at the fairgrounds for all animals. The complete requirements are listed on pages 6-15 of this Erie County Fair at Wattsburg Premium Book.

ERIE COUNTY FAIR AT WATTSBURG **ANIMAL HEALTH RULES**

Pennsylvania Cattle:

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 1, 2022.
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this should be written on the CVI.
3. Individual official animal identification.

Official ID will have a US shield  and includes:

A USDA-issued National Uniform Eartagging System (NUES) tag; or

A 15-digit Animal Identification Number eartag starting with "840" (including RFID) or Other official identification approved by PDA. (Brands and breed registrations with tattoos are not acceptable).


4. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for animals 3 months of age and older (*market cattle are exempt*).

Out of State Cattle:

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 30 days prior to the date of importation is required.

2. Vesicular Stomatitis (VS): (applies to states that experienced a Vesicular Stomatitis outbreak in the last 12 months). An accredited veterinarian shall determine whether the animals are free from VS, and animals shall be accompanied by a CVI with the following statement signed by the accredited veterinarian: "All animals identified on this certificate of veterinary inspection have been examined and found to be free from VS. During the past 90 days, these animals were not located within 10 miles of a site where VS has been diagnosed."

3. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI.

4. Individual official animal identification is required. Official ID will have a US shield  and includes:

A USDA-issued National Uniform Ear tagging System (NUES) tag; or

A 15-digit Animal Identification Number starting with "840" ear tag (including RFID) or

Other official identification approved by USDA. (Brands and breed registrations with tattoos are not acceptable).

5. Testing: Tuberculosis Requirements:

No test is required for animals originating from "Accredited Free" states or zones.

All exhibition animals originating from states or zones designated "Modified Accredited Advanced" must be test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of importation. The negative test results and date of test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (a copy of the original report is acceptable).

All animals originating from states or zones designated "Modified Accredited" must originate from herds in which all animals 12 months of age and older are test negative within the 12 months prior to the date of importation; and the individual animals to be imported (all ages) are test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of importation and at least 60 days after the negative whole herd test. The negative test results and date of test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (a copy of the original test report is acceptable).

6. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for animals 3 months of age and older (*market cattle are exempt*).

Pennsylvania Equine Animals:

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 1, 2022.

2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this should be written on the CVI.

3. All equine animals must be test negative for EIA by an official test within the 12 months prior to the opening date of the exhibition. Laboratory test results must accompany each animal to its final destination (a copy of the original lab report is acceptable). The CVI shall specify the date of sample collection, date of results, and results of the EIA test, along with the accession number and the name of the testing laboratory. Foals less than six months of age accompanied by a test-negative dam are exempt from EIA testing requirements. If the foal is not accompanied by the dam, a copy of the dam's test results must accompany the foal to its final destination.

4. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for animals 3 months of age and older.

Out of State Equine Animals:

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 30 days prior to the date of importation is required.

2. Vesicular Stomatitis (VS): (applies to states that experienced a Vesicular Stomatitis outbreak in the last 12 months). An accredited veterinarian shall determine whether the animals are free from VS, and animals shall be accompanied by a CVI with the following statement signed by the accredited veterinarian: "All animals identified on this certificate of veterinary inspection have been examined and found to be free from VS. During the past 90 days, these animals were not located within 10 miles of a site where VS has been diagnosed."

3. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI.


4. All equine animals must be test negative for EIA by an official test within the 12 months prior to the date of importation. Laboratory test results must accompany each animal to its final destination (a copy of the original lab report is acceptable). The CVI shall specify the date of sample collection, date of results, and results of the EIA test, along with the accession number and the name of the testing laboratory. Foals less than six months of age accompanied by a test-negative dam are exempt from EIA testing requirements. If the foal is not accompanied by the dam, a copy of the dam's test results must accompany the foal to its final destination.

5. If an equine animal has resided in Texas or New Mexico for a cumulative total of 30 days or more within the six months preceding the date of entry into the Commonwealth, that animal must be test-negative for *Babesia caballi* and *Theileria equi* on a competitive enzyme-linked immunosorbent assay (c-ELISA) test, or a Department-approved equivalent test, with the test occurring within the 30 days preceding entry into Pennsylvania. The date of test and the test results shall be written on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

6. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for animals 3 months of age and older.

Pennsylvania Goats:

Individual official animal identification is required for all goats. Official ID includes:

A USDA ear tag with a US shield  ; or

A legible tattoo with herd and individual identification recognized in an approved USDA Scrapie database a.k.a scrapie tattoo (only for herds enrolled in the USDA Voluntary Scrapie Herd Certification Program) or

A breed registration tattoo if the animal is accompanied by a registration certificate and the tattoo is legible.

A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 1, 2022.

2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this should be written on the CVI.


Section 11: Out of State Goats:

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 30 days prior to the date of importation.

2. Vesicular Stomatitis (VS): (applies to states that experienced a Vesicular Stomatitis outbreak in the last 12 months). An accredited veterinarian shall determine whether the animals are free from VS, and animals shall be accompanied by a CVI with the following statement signed by the accredited veterinarian: "All animals identified on this certificate of veterinary inspection have been examined and found to be free from VS. During the past 90 days, these animals were not located within 10 miles of a site where VS has been diagnosed."

3. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI.

4. Individual official animal identification is required for all goats. Official ID includes:

i. A USDA ear tag with a US shield  ; or

ii. A legible tattoo with herd and individual identification recognized in an approved USDA Scrapie database a.k.a scrapie tattoo (only for herds enrolled in the USDA Voluntary Scrapie Herd Certification Program) or

iii. A breed registration tattoo if the animal is accompanied by a registration certificate and the tattoo is legible.

5. Testing requirements: Tuberculosis:

§ No test is required for animals originating from states or zones designated as accredited-free by the USDA.

§ All animals originating from states or zones designated modified accredited advanced by the USDA must be test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of importation. The negative test results

and date of test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (a copy of the original report is acceptable).

§ All animals originating from states or zones designated modified accredited must originate from herds in which all animals 12 months of age and older have tested negative within the 12 months prior to the date of importation; and the individual animals (all ages) to be imported have also tested negative within the 60 days prior to the date of importation and at least 60 days after the negative whole herd test was completed. The negative test results and date of test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (a copy of the original test report is acceptable).

Pennsylvania Rabbits:

All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases.

Out of State Rabbits: **Requirements:**

No rabbits or their products, such as, meat, pelts, hides, carcasses or other items, and no equipment, exposed feed, forages, or conveyances or other items or associated materials may enter the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania from a Commonwealth, State, Territory, or Country where Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease (RHD) has been diagnosed in the prior twelve (12) months or there is a reasonable suspicion it exists unless they meet the following requirements:
(a) All live rabbits must be accompanied by an ICVI and must be examined by an accredited veterinarian within the seventy-two (72) hours prior to the date of shipment to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The ICVI must include statements by an accredited veterinarian certifying that:

- (i) All rabbits in the shipment have been examined for and found free of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases;
 - (ii) All rabbits have originated from a single remises that has no signs of infectious, contagious or communicable disease in rabbits;
 - (iii) There have been no movements of rabbits onto the premises of origin within the 90 days prior to the date of shipment; and
 - (iv) The rabbits have had no contact with wild or captive rabbits other than their cohorts in the 90 days prior to the date of shipment.
- (b) No rabbits or their products, such as, meat, pelts, hides, carcasses or other items, and no equipment

exposed feed or conveyances or other items or associated materials may enter the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania from a premises exposed to, contaminated with or known to be affected with RHD, or where there is a reasonable suspicion the disease exists or the rabbits have been exposed to or infected with RHD. Fair management has the authority to impose additional requirements designed to prevent the spread of contagious diseases.


Recommendations:

For Rabbits that originate from a from a Commonwealth, State, Territory, or Country where RHD has NOT been diagnosed in the prior twelve (12) months or there is NO reasonable suspicion it exists:

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within 30 days prior to the date of importation.
2. A statement on the CVI attesting that all rabbits listed on the CVI are free of signs of infectious and contagious disease.

Pennsylvania Sheep:

Individual official USDA scrapie animal identification is required for all sheep. Official scrapie ID includes:

- A USDA ear tag with a US shield  ; or
 - A legible tattoo with herd and individual identification recognized in an approved USDA Scrapie database a.k.a. a scrapie tattoo (only for flocks enrolled in the USDA Voluntary Scrapie Flock Certification Program) or
 - A breed registration tattoo if the animals are accompanied by a registration certificate (copy acceptable) and the tattoo is legible.
1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 1, 2022.
 2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this should be written on the CVI.
 3. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for animals 3 months of age and older.


Out of State Sheep:

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 30 days prior to entry into PA is required.
2. Vesicular Stomatitis (VS): (applies to states that experienced a Vesicular Stomatitis outbreak in the last 12 months). An accredited veterinarian shall

determine whether the animals are free from VS, and animals shall be accompanied by a CVI with the following statement signed by the accredited veterinarian: "All animals identified on this certificate of veterinary inspection have been examined and found to be free from VS. During the past 90 days, these animals were not located within 10 miles of a site where VS has been diagnosed."

3. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI.

4. Individual official USDA scrapie animal identification is required. Official scrapie ID includes:

A USDA ear tag with a US shield  ;or

A legible tattoo with herd and individual identification recognized in an approved USDA Scrapie database; a.k.a. A scrapie tattoo (only for flocks enrolled in USDA Voluntary Scrapie Flock Program or

A breed registration tattoo if the animals are accompanied by a registration certificate. (copy acceptable) and the tattoo is legible.

5. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for animals 3 months of age and older.

Pennsylvania Swine:

Requirements:

1. No swine species shall be exhibited in Pennsylvania unless each animal:

*Is accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI) issued within 14 days of the fair.

*Is permanently identified by an official 840 series radio frequency identification (RFID) ear tag and the ear tag number is recorded on the CVI:

*Has been visually inspected and found to be free of signs of contagious disease immediately prior to unloading at the exhibition by an accredited veterinarian or swine health monitor appointed by the fair board or livestock show committee.

3. All Market swine exhibited in Department sponsored Market shows shall move directly to a PDA or USDA licensed slaughter facility following the animal exhibition and may not be diverted to premises other than a recognized

slaughter establishment or a slaughter market in which the sales are designated slaughter only sales.

Out of State Swine:

Requirements:

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 14 days prior to the date of the show is required. The CVI shall include a statement verifying that the swine have not been Fed raw garbage.

2. Vesicular Stomatitis (VS) Statement: This applies to states that experienced a VS outbreak in the last 12 months. In these cases, an accredited veterinarian shall determine whether the animals are free from VS, and animals shall be accompanied by a CVI with the following statement signed by the accredited veterinarian: "All animals identified on this CVI have been examined and found to be free from VS. During the past 90 days, these animals were not located within 10 miles of a site where VS has been diagnosed."

3. All animals must be free of evidence of Infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI.

4. Has been visually inspected and found to be free of signs of contagious disease immediately prior to unloading at the exhibition by an accredited veterinarian or swine health monitor appointed by the fair board or livestock show committee.

5. Individual animal ID – must be permanently identified by an official 840 series radio frequency identification (RFID) ear tag and the ear tag number is recorded on the CVI.

6. Brucellosis Testing Requirements: No test required if the animal originates from a validated brucellosis-free state or brucellosis-free herd. All others must be tested negative within the 30 days prior to the date of importation.

7. Pseudorabies Testing Requirements:
a. Sexually intact swine over 6 months of age shall originate qualified PRV negative herd or be test negative to an official pseudorabies test within 30 days prior to importation.
b. No pseudorabies testing required for all other swine.

9. All Market swine exhibited in Department sponsored Market shows shall move directly to a PDA or USDA licensed slaughter facility following the animal exhibition and may not be diverted to premises other than a recognized

slaughter establishment or a slaughter market in which the sales are designated slaughter only sales.

Pennsylvania Poultry, Including Chickens, Turkeys, Waterfowl, Upland Game Birds, Ratites, and Pigeons, Doves and Other Avian Species and Hatching Eggs

Requirements:

1. All Pennsylvania poultry, including chickens, turkeys, waterfowl, and upland game birds entering an exhibition must bear an official PDA-issued crimp style or butt end style leg band. Ratites must be identified with a neck band and electronic implant device (the exhibitor must supply a reader). Pigeons, doves, and avian species other than poultry must bear a unique individual identification leg band but do not have to be identified with an official PDA leg band.

2. An Owner-endorsed Avian Health Certificate or a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (health chart or CVI) must accompany Pennsylvania poultry, including chickens, turkeys, waterfowl, upland game birds, and ratites; pigeons, doves, and other avian species; and hatching eggs. The certificate must include the following:

- Name and location of exhibition; and Name, address, and telephone number of the owner; and
- A statement that the entries and the flock of origin are free of evidence of infectious and contagious diseases; and Description of the birds, hatching eggs; and Owner signature and date that

3. **Avian Influenza Testing and Verification:** All samples must be collected by a Certified Poultry Technician or a Category II Accredited Veterinarian. All poultry, including chickens, turkeys, waterfowl, upland game birds, and ratites (pigeons, doves, and avian species other than poultry are excluded), and their hatching eggs for exhibition must originate from a flock in which a random, representative sample of a minimum of 30 birds, 3 weeks of age or older, were tested for avian influenza within the 30 days prior to opening date of the exhibition. The birds or hatching eggs must be accompanied by the most recent test report (copy acceptable). Test results must be negative. If there are fewer than 30 birds in the flock, test all birds. For waterfowl, cloacal swab

collected for testing instead of blood samples, and the swabs may be tested using PCR techniques. Swabs from geese and ducks may not be combined in the same tube for testing. Untested birds shall not be comingled with or added to the tested flock after negative samples have been collected and before the show.

4. **Pullorum typhoid Testing and Verification:** All samples must be collected by a Certified Poultry Technician or a Category II Accredited Veterinarian. Poultry, including chickens, turkeys, upland game birds and ratites (PA waterfowl are excluded and pigeons, doves, and avian species other than poultry are excluded) and their hatching eggs must originate from a flock in good standing on the NPIP Pullorum typhoid Clean Program (and there was no break in the chain of ownership by NPIP participants) and the birds must be accompanied by an NPIP 9-3 form with that flock's NPIP number; or from a flock in good standing on the PA Pullorum Equivalent Program. The birds or hatching eggs must be accompanied by the most recent test report (copy acceptable). If a rapid whole blood plate test is done, the most recent NPIP 9-2 form or state equivalent form must accompany the birds or hatching eggs (copy acceptable). Test results must be negative. **OR** All individual birds (PA waterfowl are excluded and pigeons, doves and avian species other than poultry are excluded) for exhibition (maximum of 10 birds) must have a pullorum typhoid test within 30 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition. The birds must be accompanied by the most recent test report, or state equivalent form for the rapid test (copies acceptable). Test results must be negative. The following age restrictions apply: Chickens shall be tested at 4 months of age or older. Turkeys shall be tested at 12 weeks of age or older. Game birds shall be tested at 4 months of age or older, or upon sexual maturity, whichever comes first. Ratites shall be tested at 12 months of age or older. All birds not meeting these age restrictions at the time of sampling are exempt from pullorum typhoid testing requirements.

Out of State Poultry, Including Chickens, Turkeys, Waterfowl, Upland Game Birds, Ratites, and Pigeons, Doves and Other Avian Species and Hatching Eggs

Requirements:

1. All poultry, including chickens, turkeys, waterfowl, and upland game birds entering an exhibition must bear an official leg band issued by the state or country of origin.

2. Ratites must be identified with a neck band or an electronic implant device (the exhibitor must supply a reader). Pigeons, doves, and avian species other than poultry must bear a leg band for individual identification but do not have to be identified with an official state leg band.

3. An Owner-endorsed Avian Health Certificate or a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (health chart or CVI) must accompany all poultry, including chickens, turkeys, waterfowl, upland game birds, and ratites; and all other avian species; and hatching eggs. The health Certificate or CVI must include the following:

a. The testing laboratory name, test accession number(s), and a statement indicating negative test results; and

b. Name and location of exhibitor; and

c. Name, address, and telephone number of the owner; and

d. Description of the birds/hatching eggs; and

e. A statement that the entries and the flock of origin are free of evidence of infectious and contagious diseases; and

f. Owner signature and date of that signature.

4. **IMPORTANT:** A copy of the Owner Endorsed Avian Interstate/International Health Statement or CVI and the laboratory test report including negative test results must also be sent to PDA within the seven (7) days after the date of entry into Pennsylvania.

5. **Avian Influenza Testing and Verification:** All samples must be collected by a Certified Poultry Technician or a Category II Accredited Veterinarian. All poultry, including chickens, turkeys, waterfowl, upland game birds, and ratites, (pigeons, doves and avian species other than poultry are excluded), and their hatching eggs must originate from a flock in which a random,

Representative sample of a minimum; a. of 30 birds, 3 weeks of age or older, were tested for avian influenza within the 30 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition. The birds or hatching eggs must be accompanied by the most recent test report (copy acceptable). Test results must be negative. If there are fewer than 30 birds in the flock, test all birds. For waterfowl, cloacal swab samples must be collected for testing, and the swabs may be tested using PCR techniques. Swabs from geese and ducks may not be combined in the same tube for testing. Untested birds shall not be comingled with or added to the tested flock after negative samples have been collected and before the show.

6. **Pullorum typhoid Testing and Verification:** All samples must be collected by a Certified Poultry Technician or a Category II Accredited Veterinarian.

1. All poultry, including upland chickens, turkeys, waterfowl, and upland game birds, and ratites (pigeons, doves and avian species other than poultry are excluded) and hatching eggs must come from a NPIP Pullorum typhoid Clean flocks in good standing with the program (and there was no break in the chain of ownership by NPIP participants) and the birds must be accompanied by an NPIP 9-3 form with that flock's NPIP number. **OR**

2. All poultry, including upland chickens, turkeys, waterfowl, and ratites (pigeons, doves, and avian species other than poultry are excluded) (maximum of 300) must have had a negative pullorum typhoid test within the 30 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition. The birds must be accompanied by the most recent test report (copy acceptable). If the rapid whole-blood plate agglutination test was done, the most recent state form for the rapid test (copies acceptable) must accompany the birds (copy acceptable). Test results must be negative. The following age restrictions apply to comply with NPIP standards:

3. Chickens shall be tested at 4 months of age or older.

4. Turkeys shall be tested at 12 weeks of age or older.

5. Game birds shall be tested at 4 months of age or older, or upon sexual maturity, whichever comes first.
6. Ratites shall be tested at 12 months of age or older.
7. Waterfowl shall be tested at 4 months of age or older.
8. All birds not meeting these age restrictions at the time of sampling must come from a flock in which all the eligible birds in the flock (up to 300) have been test negative within the 30 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition.

9. OFFICIAL OWNER ENDORSED AVIAN HEALTH CERTIFICATE FOR ALL EXHIBITION BIRDS AND THEIR HATCHING EGGS

a. A completed owner-endorsed avian health certificate or a certificate of veterinary inspection must accompany all exhibition species and their hatching eggs to an exhibition. The certificate must be presented to exhibition management prior to coop or aviary of any species or display of hatching eggs. This owner-endorsed health certificate must be endorsed with the bird owner's signature.

4. Verification of Testing for all poultry, including chickens, turkeys, waterfowl, game birds (such as pheasants, partridge, quail, grouse, guineas), ratites, and hatching eggs (all samples must be collected by a Certified Poultry Technician or a Category II Accredited Veterinarian):

a. Avian influenza testing and verification:

b. Pullorum typhoid testing and verification:

i. National Animal Health Laboratory Network (NAHLN) for sample collection, including the number of swabs/tube of viral transport media (see vi and vii below), and testing shall be followed. All samples must be tested at a NAHLN laboratory. ii. All poultry, including chickens, turkeys, waterfowl, game birds, and ratites, and their hatching eggs must eliminate from a flock in which a random, representative sample of a minimum of 30 birds, 5 weeks of age or older, were tested for avian influenza within the 30 days prior to entry into the exhibition.

iii. If there are fewer than 30 birds in the flock, all birds of age must be tested.

iv. Test results must be negative.

v. All poultry and hatching eggs must be accompanied by the most recent test report (photocopies are acceptable).

vi. Chickens, turkeys, game birds, and ratites may meet the testing requirements with blood testing or tracheal/oropharyngeal swab testing. If swab samples are collected, swabs from different species e.g., chickens and turkeys may not be combined in a tube of viral transport media (BHI). If 5 or fewer swabs are collected per tube,

the swab tips may be left in the tube. If between 5 and 11 swabs per tube are collected, swirl the swab tip in the BHI liquid, press the swab tip against the inner surface of the tube to remove excess material into the tube, and discard the swab in a biosecure manner.

vii. Waterfowl such as ducks and geese must be tested with cloacal swab samples. Swabs from different species — e.g., ducks and geese — may not be combined in a tube of viral transport media (BHI). Up to 5 swabs may be placed per tube for waterfowl testing. Swabs may be left in the tube.

viii. Poultry not meeting the testing requirements shall not be comingled with or added to the tested flock after negative samples have been collected and before poultry or hatching eggs enter the exhibition.

~~Poultry, including chickens, turkeys, game birds, and ratites (waterfowl are excluded), and poultry hatching eggs;~~

- (1). Must originate from a flock currently enrolled, tested, and in good standing on the NPIP Pullorumtyphoid Clean Program, with no break in the chain of ownership by NPIP participants, and the poultry or hatching eggs must be accompanied by the most recent laboratory test report or 9-3 form (*Report of Testing in Eggs, Chicks, or Poult*) which includes the NPIP number; or NPIP 9-2 (*Summary of Selecting and Testing Report*) for the rapid whole blood agglutination plate test which includes the NPIP number (photocopies are acceptable); or
- (2). Must originate from a flock currently enrolled, tested, and in good standing on the PA Pullorum Equivalent Program, with no break in the chain of ownership by program participants, and the poultry or hatching eggs must be accompanied by the most recent laboratory test report which includes the program enrollment number, or state rapid test reporting form for the rapid whole blood agglutination plate test for pullorum typhoid which includes the program enrollment number (photocopies are acceptable); or

- (3). All individual poultry, including chickens, turkeys, game birds, and ratites (waterfowl are excluded), or poultry providing hatching eggs (maximum of 300 from a flock) entering a Pennsylvania exhibition must have had a pullorum typhoid test within the ninety (90) days prior to the opening date of the exhibition. The poultry or hatching eggs must be accompanied by the most recent laboratory test report; or the Department's rapid test reporting form for the rapid whole blood agglutination plate test for pullorum typhoid performed on non-NPIP birds (photocopies are acceptable).

(4). Test results must be negative.

- (5). The following age restrictions apply for pullorum typhoid testing:

Chickens shall be tested at 4 months of age or older.

*Turkeys shall be tested at 12 weeks of age or older.

*Game birds shall be tested at 4 months of age or older, or up to sexual maturity, whichever comes first.

*Ratites shall be tested at 12 months of age or older.

All poultry which is individually tested for pullorum typhoid must have a negative result at the time of entry into the exhibition.

4. Bird identification: All poultry, including chickens, turkeys, waterfowl, and game birds entering an exhibition must bear an individual **OFFICIAL STATE LEG BAND**. For PA poultry, official crimp-style leg bands will show "PDA" on the bands, and official Butt-end band numbers begin with the prefix "PA". Ratites must be identified with a neck band or an electronic implant device (the exhibitor must supply a reader). Pigeons, doves, and other avian species such as psittacines and passerines must bear a unique individual identification leg band (official state leg bands are not required except for poultry).

All samples must be tested at a NAHLN laboratory. (excluding the Pullorum/typhoid rapid whole blood plate agglutination test that may be conducted at farm)~~

CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who complete in structured classes of competition.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under as affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or responsible person shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of drugs. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter,

trainer and/or responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animals entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state, and provincial statutes, regulations, and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state, and provincial statutes, regulation and rules affect the performance or appearance at the event. If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prime facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the approved laboratory to which it is send is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was take, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise at any hearing in regard to the matter conducted by the fair or livestock show. At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal is prohibited.

6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, use electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representative, or show officials before, during or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.

9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether he or she was instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.

10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or responsible person to have any disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show against such individuals published in any publication of the IAFE, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to member.

11. The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understand the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also a violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

12. Veterinarian Consultation Relationship A relationship in which the owner or caretaker of the animal has assumed responsibility to consult a veterinarian and has agreed to follow the instructions of the veterinarian in relation to zoonotic diseases and implementing best management practices intended to reduce and prevent diseases. Your signature on the entry form confirms your compliance.





- 2. Entries open Sunday, August 28, 2022 at 9:00 AM and close at 8:00 PM August 28, 2022. Horse must be on grounds by August 28, 2022 @ 8:00 PM.
- 3. Judging starts Monday, August 29, 2022.
- 4. All entries must be on Fair Entry Forms. No additional sheets accepted. May make copies of entry forms.
- 5. All horses must have copies of registration papers or will be placed in the "all other" class. No exceptions.



2. JUDGING BEGINS TUESDAY, August 30, 2022.
3. AN "ANIMAL Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship" form must be presented upon arrival at all shows and fairs in Pennsylvania, including out-of-state entries. (Form included at back of this Premium Book.)
4. All breeding stock must be Pure-bred animals (unless otherwise stated). any animal over six months of age must be recorded in the Registry Association for the respective breed.
5. All animals must be owned by the exhibitor 30 days prior to this show.
6. Any animal or animals entered in a person's name, other than the names or name on the Registration Certificate, shall be barred from competition and will receive no premiums.
7. The Superintendent reserves the right to bar from competition animals with decidedly inferior conformation and those not possessing sufficient merit to warrant recognition.
8. No more than two entries will be accepted for any premium.
9. Exhibitors will be expected to display or parade their animals as directed by the superintendent, to accept the stall assigned without controversy, to keep their animals in an attractive appearance and to cooperate with the Department in every way that may serve to increase the educational value of the show.
10. Exhibitors of livestock must inform themselves as to when their stock will be judged. Health Requirements:

Erie County Fair at Wattsburg animal health rules are to be followed in all animal departments and contests. Appropriate documentation of necessary immunizations must be presented upon arrival at the fairgrounds for all animals. The complete requirements are listed in the front of the Erie County Fair at Wattsburg Premium Book.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

(All general rules apply)

Cooping:

1. Exhibitors must have all animals listed for competition on the grounds not later than
2. ENTRY FEE: \$.50 cents per head.
3. Youth exhibitors may enter any bird in the Open Class department, however, when entering in the open class, the youth must pay ALL appropriate fees.
4. Entries in this department will be accepted from bona fide owners. All birds must be owned by the individuals exhibiting them and they must have been owned for 30 days prior to the day of judging.
5. Competition is open to residents of Erie and adjoining counties in PA, except by permission of the committee.
6. The management assumes no responsibility in case of loss or damage of stock or other exhibits from any cause and upon this condition only are exhibits received. Diseased birds will not be accepted. In case of death of an entry, it will be returned to the exhibitor.
7. Cage assignments will be made by the superintendent. Late entries will be accepted if there is space. Entries in the department will be limited to the regular exhibition of the fair.
8. The superintendent will grant permission only for the late arrival or early removal of animals being shown at a competing show which conflicts with the above times. (Early removal must ONLY be done AFTER THE SHOW IS COMPLETE. Early removal will result in forfeiture of premiums. Superintendent has granted permission to re-enter animal.)
9. The decision of the judge shall be final, except where error, mistake, fraud, misrepresentation, collusion, not discovered, or proven. In such cases the decision of the superintendent or such referee appointed shall be final, the judge will be governed by the latest American Standard of Perfection.
10. Only breeds/varieties accepted by the American Standard of Perfection will be accepted.
11. Only one entry will be accepted from an exhibitor for any premium.




Rabbit Show Rules

1. All rabbits must have a permanent and legible ear tattoo.
2. All rabbits to be judged according to the latest ARBA standard of perfection except for pet class.
3. The pet class is for **YOUTH** exhibitors ages 17 and under only and will be judged separately. Any adult entries entered in this class will be disqualified.
4. All standard breed entries must include: class, breed and ear number. Please list color/variety under description. Meat pen entries must include section, class, breed, and ear number. Please list color/variety under description. Pet entries must include section and class.
5. The fair reserves the right to combine breeds or varieties with few entries for the purpose of judging. GC Legs will not be issued for combined classes.
7. **NO DOES WITH LITTERS WILL BE ACCEPTED.**
8. A meat pen shall consist of three rabbits of the same breed and variety. All three rabbits must be under ten weeks of age, and each must weigh at least 3 1/2 lbs. and not to exceed 5 1/2 lbs.
9. PLEASE trim nails before bringing to the Fair.



10. Rabbits will be accepted on Sunday August 28, 2022 from 12:00 PM-8:00 PM. No rabbits are to be placed in the barn before noon. All rabbits must be checked in by the rabbit barn superintendent. If not checked in, they cannot be in the barn. The check in serves as a safety measure and also ensures they are placed into their assigned coops.

11. Ribbons will be awarded to 5th place and premiums paid to 3rd place in regular breed classes. Ribbons will be awarded to 3rd place, and only one premium will be paid in the pet class.
12. Best of Breed, Best Opposite of Breed, Best of Variety, and Best Opposite Variety premiums will only be awarded with five or more rabbits entered in the breed or variety. No premiums will awarded for Best of Group.
13. Judging will take place on Wednesday, August 31, 2022 by a licensed ARBA judge.
14. Rabbits will be released at 9:00 PM on Saturday, the last day of the Fair, **NONE WILL BE RELEASED EARLIER.** This also applies to rabbits purchased by non exhibitors. Removal before 9:00PM will result in forfeiture of any and all premiums. **All rabbits must be removed from the barn by 11:00 PM Saturday night.**
15. All showroom sales will be handled by the show superintendent. A 10% fee from every sale will be collected to benefit upkeep of the barn and to purchase supplies for next years show.

2. **Entrants may NOT have won 1st place in this Blue Ribbon Apple Pie contest at any other fair in 2022.**
3. Entire entry must be **made from scratch**. No pre-packaged ingredients may be used (*ex: pre-made mixes, cookie dough, pie crust, frosting, etc.*) **All ingredients and decorations must be edible.**
4. Recipe **must include at least 60% apples in the filling**. It does not need to be a “traditional” two crusted apple pie and it can have a variety of fillings.
5. The entire pie must be submitted for judging in a food safe disposable pie pan. (*All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.*)
6. The recipe for the pie and pie crust must be submitted with the entry. It should be submitted on one side of 8 ½” by 11” paper. The recipe must list all the ingredients, quantities, and the preparation instructions. Entrant’s name, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages. (*All recipes and pies will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.*)
7. Refrigeration is not available at the Fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.







2022 FARM STOCK TRACTOR RULES

1. No consumption of alcoholic beverages or narcotics in tractor pit area. Failure to observe rules will result in removal from track or pit area with no refund of entry fee, also will be barred from pulling with this organization for one full year.
2. All contestants must be 12 years of age with written parental consent through age 18. All drivers must wear shoes that completely cover the foot (no sandals), shirt, long pants, and helmet before they are permitted to compete.
3. Judges have the right to re-weigh or re-tech any tractor anytime during or after the pull.
4. All engine fans must be shrouded with factory shroud or minimum of 1/16" thick steel.
5. No weight may extend more than 24" beyond the most forward point of the tractor.
6. The tractor tires must remain in the boundaries of the contest course.
7. Minimum draw bar length of 18" from the center of the rear axle to the point of hook. Draw bar must be stationary in all directions. Maximum height of 20" from top of hitching device parallel to the ground. Clevis to be measured to the center.

8. Draw bar to be equipped with steel hitching device not more than 1.5" thick and a 3" diameter opening. Cross sectional thickness must be measured 7/8" minimum to 1.5" maximum. Pulling point must not be more than 1.5" from back edge of the pulling device.
9. No pressurized tanks unless UL approved. No nitrous oxide, or propane.
10. All tractors must compete using the fuel tractor was intended by the factory.
11. All tractors competing must run under a working governor. All throttle stops must be permanent, no vice grips or other temporary fixtures/rigging.
12. No portion of the tractor may interfere with any portion of the sled or the sled hitching device during the pull. this includes weights. Hooking and unhook of tractor must have EASY, CLEAR access.
13. All weights must be secured to the tractor (no tarp straps). No weights permitted on the seat or deck, this includes cab tractors. Any ballast or external parts lost while hooded to the sled will be cause for disqualification of that class, excludes internal parts.
14. All tractors must be equipped with workable rear brakes. use of torque converters, power shifts, etc. is permitted.
15. Contestant has 50 feet to the front of the tractor to decide on change of gear, one restart per class. No restart permitted in a pull off.
16. Driver must be in total control of the tractor wheel at all times while pulling and operate in a safe manner or be disqualified at the discretion of the flag person.
17. Tractor must be stopped upon signal from either track official. Pull is considered over when forward motion of the sled stops, no hole digging allowed.
18. All tractors must be in neutral or park transmission selector while being hooked and unhooked.
19. The number one puller will be the test puller, and may take the pull if the working condition of the weight machine is satisfactory. Driver will have the option to take the pull or drop to the sixth pulling position. All decisions on re-pulls must be made before the tractor leaves the track. In the event the weight transfer is changed there is no option to drop.
20. Each contestant may spot the sled for their pull. Contestants must notify track official or sled operator before the sled is backed into start position.
21. All contestants must pull in position drawn within 3 minutes of sled spotting or will be disqualified. Track officials must be notified of any delays, and then the contestant may become last puller.
22. All pulls must start with a tight hitch, no jerking.
23. Violation of any rule will result in automatic disqualification. Tack official has the right to stop and disqualify any tractor at any time,. Disqualification for any tech reason during a pulling event will lose all points and moneys for that event.
24. Registration closes at the start of the first class, unless due to traffic conditions. Judges decision to be final.
25. No bracing above center of the rear axle unless cradled, except complete factory setup.
26. All classes must have a hood, grill, and fenders.
27. A pace tractor may be used operating at 3 mph.
28. There will be a 3000 rpm limit on all classes.

29. Tire size limited to 24.5 wide and 42 high maximum.
30. Contest open to two wheel drive farm stock tractors with rubber tires. No sharpened tires, no dual tires, no studs or chains permitted. Four wheel drive tractors are permitted if front wheels are disengaged.
31. Tractor motor and chassis must confirm with one another, including carburetor and injection system, electric supply pumps are permitted.
32. No tractor may pull more than once in any class.
33. No rules will be changed or overlooked throughout the year, unless for safety reasons.
34. Failure to obey either flag person will result in disqualification of that class.
35. Any fighting will result in removal from grounds without refund of any entry fees and prize moneys.
36. Tractors are required to have a working PTO.
37. Add on turbo is permitted, no bigger than a 3LM housing with a 3" inlet maximum and 3" outlet. Other turbo must be factory equipped size and specs. Limit of one turbo. No other type of force air is permitted.
38. Any tractor competing with a turbo charger must have two 3/8" grade 5 bolts in the exhaust as close to the turbo outlet as possible. These bolts must be installed with 1" of each other and at a 90 degree angle to one another to form a "X" pattern on Tuff Farm.



1. No consumption of alcoholic beverages in the track or pit area. Anyone believed to be a potential safety hazard will be barred. Failure to observe the rules will result in the removal from the track or pit area with no refund or entry fee.
2. Judges have the right to re-weigh any truck.
3. Any driver arguing with a track official or event personnel is subject to immediate disqualification. All decisions of the track officials will be final at each pull. Any protest will be settled at the next club meeting.
4. Contest open to 4 wheel drive truck or utility vehicles with 4-6-8-10 cylinders.
5. No tire chains or studs-no dual wheels except 8,500 lbs., no 4-wheel drive tractors.
6. All vehicles must have a current inspection, registration and insurance. Proof of all 3 may be requested at any time during the event.
7. Hitches stock and open classes:
 - A. Maximum height of 25" from ground to SOLID POINT of hook-up, not using a clevis. Puller must supply a 3 inch clevis of their own.
 - B. Hitch bracing not to exceed 25" from hitch forward or under vehicle.
 - C. No under bed or over bed hook-ups permitted.
8. Weights, stock and open classes.
 - A. Weights are permitted in bed or cargo area if tailgate is in place.
 - B. No front mounted weights in street class, also no weights hanging anywhere on the vehicle.
9. Engine 5,500 & 7,000 stock classes.
 - A. Engine to be stock as from factory, no intake or exhaust changes. Dual exhaust allowed. No headers, air filters such as (K&N) set ups will ruled on by track officials.
 - B. Updated carburetors will be allowed, but no spacer plates and no manifold changes.

C. Ignition components must be of factory replacement. No MSD, Accel Coils or Dual Point Ignition in stock classes.

D. Fuel pump gas ONLY, all forms of nitrous are illegal as fuel or additives. Electrical fuel pumps permitted. Diesel fuel on in diesel class. No propane enhancements or injectors.

10. Drive line to be basically stock and remain in position as intended by factory.
11. SUSPENSION: No solid blocking between frame and axle, no solid suspensions, no traction bars and no lift kits.
12. AXLES- No welded or spooled front or rear axles. Vehicles must be able to drive ON and OFF the track without stopping to lock or unlock front or rear axles so you can turn.
13. Any changes of pulling vehicles from manufacturers original intention will move your vehicle to open classes.
14. 5,800 and 6,800 Open Gas Classes: Open classes were made for vehicles that have some sort of modification to them.
 - A. Engine must run on pump fuel. No nitrous or enhancement fueling.
 - B. Headers will be allowed and can open.
 - C. Traction bars will be allowed in open.
 - D. Axles may have lockers or posy traction, but not be welded or spooled. Vehicle must be able to turn ON and OFF from the track with no help from an outside person.
15. All trucks must pull forward.
16. All trucks must enter and leave the track under their own power.
17. All pulls must start with a tight hitch, no jerking permitted.

OFFICIALS HAVE THE RIGHT TO STOP AND DISQUALIFY A TRUCK IF THE PULL WAS NOT STARTED WITH A TIGHT HITCH.
18. Drivers may not consume alcohol before or during the pull event.
19. JUDGES HAVE THE RIGHT TO DISQUALIFY ANY DRIVERS AND VEHICLES FOR UNSAFE OPERATION IN THE PITS AND ON THE TRACK.
20. No passengers permitted in vehicles during the pull or in staging areas.
21. Any ballast lost while hooked to a sled will be cause for disqualification.
22. No frame alterations and no hood modifications.
23. Vehicles to have original equipment as intended by manufacturer with body, hood and fenders. All beds must be street legal. The vehicles must have bumpers both front and rear.
24. First puller in class may forfeit first pull, then pull third and THIRD ONLY.
25. All decisions of the track judges are FINAL and are not appealable. ANY ARGUING WITH JUDGES COULD RESULT IN IMMEDIATE DISQUALIFICATION AND NO REFUND OF HOOK FEE.
26. NO HAUL-INS EXCEPT TUFF TRUCK CLASS.

3. Twenty (20) foot foul lines: on/over these lines disqualified pull; counts as a pull with no distance.
4. Three (3) passes to the sled constitutes one (1) pull.
 - a. First and second pull to be direction of judges.
 - b. Unhitch or fail to hitch; pass on second pull.
 - c. Third pull will be driver's choice of direction, providing there is enough room to do the distance (full distance).
5. Teams to pull in rotation.
6. Drivers are allowed two hitchers. They are not allowed to touch or speak to the horses while they are in motion. they must also stay behind point of hitch when horses are drawing.
7. Driver will ride the sled in a sitting position.
8. Horses will not be headed throughout contest; if it occurs the driver must unhitch and make another pass.
9. A whistle will be blown when the team has made the full distance or when forward motion of the sled stops.
10. There will be no whipping, slapping or foul language.
11. Any breakage of harness or equipment, the team is entitled to another pull if desired.
12. No additional entries after the 2nd weight has been added. Added weight is after first draw.
13. Judges decisions are final.
14. All teams must stay in the pulling area until class is over or the department head of the pull gives permission to leave.
15. All horses are subject to blood test after pull.
16. A Coggins Test will be required showing negative test within last 12 months. No horses showing clinical signs of contagious or infectious disease will be permitted.


