One weekly button per exhibitor for all animals will be issued FREE by the fair.

Additional weekly buttons are \$12.00 each. All passes good ONLY for Fair week. This pass does not include rides or Grandstand admission. Excludes Departments 11-23.

ATTENTION EXHIBITORS (Please read carefully)

All entries must be pre-entered. Once placed in the computer, entries cannot be changed. Substitutions cannot be made, i.e. if you enter a Cherry Pie, you cannot bring an Apple Pie as a substitute. If there are any questions that a certain item will be ready at fair time, pre-enter it anyway.

ALL ENTRIES MUST BE FILLED OUT COMPLETELY.

If not, they will be returned. NO animal or exhibit may be removed from the Fairgrounds prior to 9:00 PM Saturday, August 31, 2024. Removal prior to that time will result in loss of ALL Premiums.

NOTICE: The Wattsburg Agricultural Society Inc. d/ b/a Erie County Fair at Wattsburg assumes no responsibility in case of loss or damage to stock or other exhibits from any cause, and upon this condition only, are entries received. The Fair will not assume any liability for personal injury sustained either by exhibitors, helpers, visitors or guests. All persons renting privileges on the grounds and all exhibitors of livestock, machinery, etc. must so conduct their business or exhibit so that the public will not be liable to injury. In case anyone is injured, the renter or exhibitor shall assume all responsibility thereafter, and shall indemnify the Erie County Fair at Wattsburg for any and all expenses occurred by such an accident or injury.

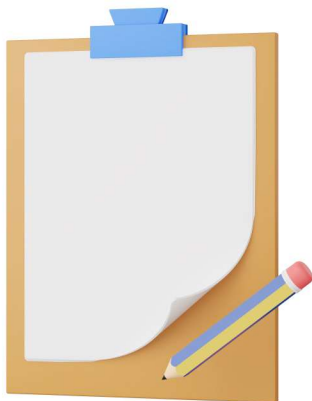
The Official Erie County Fair At Wattsburg Premium Book

GENERAL RULES

The State Premium Book has been arranged so that Fairs may incorporate all or parts of it in their individual Fair Premium Books. All Fairs who receive Fair Program Grants shall conform with this book when preparing their Premium Books. This means you shall follow the position of a Department as shown. You need not show any Departments, Divisions, Sections or Classes for which you do not want Exhibits. Every exhibit accepted for premium must be given an entry tag, which must be properly marked to show the Name of the Exhibit. In the case of live stock, breed name must be shown on cards large enough so that the breed name can be readily identified by the viewers. If the livestock is grouped together according to breed, one large sign to designate the group will be satisfactory. The ribbons or rosettes must be placed on the stall or pen of the individual winners for the duration of the Fair or show. In the case of poultry, entry tags showing species must be plainly exhibited on each cage, and winning stickers must appear on such entry tags showing winners. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in forfeiture of premiums. It will be the duty of the Fair or show officials to enforce this regulation. We want each Fair to encourage exhibitors in each class; however, in some departments, facilities may limit the number of entries. Accordingly, in some classes or divisions, you may limit the number of entries per exhibitor in each class.

JUDGING RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All exhibitors agree to be bound by the rules and regulations of The Erie County Fair at Wattsburg.
2. The Fair management reserves the right to amend or add to these guidelines as its judgment may determine.
3. Reasonable care will be taken to protect all exhibits on display from all injury and damage, but The Erie County Fair at Wattsburg, PA is not in any way to be held responsible for accidents, loss or damage by water, fire, theft or otherwise, whatever may be the cause or extent of the damage or loss.
4. All entries must have been grown, produced, or made since the last Fair, by the person whose name appears on the tag as exhibitor. If entries are to be limited to residents of the County, or to a specified area, this must be stated in the Fair's Premium Book or tabloid under the Rules Section. Any exhibitor may be required to prove ability to reproduce entry in any department in the presence of a qualified person.
5. Superintendents reserve the right to bar from competition any entry of inferior quality and those not possessing sufficient merit to warrant recognition. The Fair reserves the right to remove any exhibit not worthy of viewing by the public.
6. Food products cannot be made with any substance that causes them to become poisonous and unfit to be used for consumption. Any such incidents must be reported to the Pennsylvania Agricultural Fair Program for further review.
7. No exhibit may be removed at any time before 9:00 PM, or you will forfeit any premium. Only exception is approval from the management of the Fair.
8. Where award ribbons are stolen or destroyed, the exhibitor may receive a duplicate at the close of the Fair or show which shall be supplied by the Fair, free of charge.
9. All livestock offered for premiums must have been the property of the owners for thirty (30) days or longer. Health papers are to be issued in the name of the exhibitor.
10. The market animals should be weighed on the same set of scales under a qualified weight master, and the direction of the Fair.
11. Joint ownership is considered to be as one owner in accordance with registration papers.
12. Recognizing the fact that it is not possible to list every desirable or worthwhile class in each section of each department, and that fashion and fad, particularly in the areas of Needlecraft, Domestic Art and Fine Art, may change the norm for which it is intended, it is advised that each Fair shall add or delete classes in which they perceive to be in their own best interest. Such changes shall not in any way jeopardize the Premium reimbursement up to the maximum set forth in each Section of each Department.
13. It is permissible for each fair to establish Supreme Champion Classes.
14. Entries will be made according to classification.
15. Premiums, as listed, may be given for meritorious exhibits. In cases where there is no competition, Judges may give an award such as they deem the exhibit is worthy to receive. Same rule applies where there are fewer entries in any class than the number of premiums offered. the Judges may, at their discretion, award a ribbon or rosette.
16. The Fair reserves the right to determine how many entries they will accept from an exhibitor in the same class, or, in the case of livestock, the same breed, and poultry, the same species.
17. The decision of the judges shall be final in all cases, except where mistakes, fraud, misrepresentation or collusion, not discovered at the time of the award, is proved. In such cases, the superintendent, manager or secretary of the Fair or show, or such referee as he/she may appoint, may make the decision. The case may be appealed to the Fair management or Show Commission, from whose decision there can be no appeal. It is suggested that each Fair have a committee of three board members designated prior to fair time for this purpose. There will be no judging or prize awarded on the Danish System.
18. All protests regarding the judging must be made in writing and must plainly state the cause of the complaint or appeal. Such protests must be filed at the Fair Office within 24 hours of the occurrence.
19. It shall be the responsibility of the exhibitor to properly name the article or breed of livestock he/she is entering, any exhibit improperly entered will be disqualified to receive a premium, but the judges will make the correct name on the entry tag for the benefit of the owner so the same mistake in entering need not be made the second time.
20. Judging is viewed as an educational process and the public is encouraged to view the judging event. Any exhibitor interfering with the Judges while making awards shall forfeit any premium to which he/she would otherwise have been entitled. Each Fair is to implement this effort, based on available space.
21. Should any animal awarded a prize be disqualified, the animals gaining the lower prizes shall move into the next higher position, if in the opinion of the judges the animals are worthy of such prizes.
22. The Erie County Fair at Wattsburg reserves the right to withhold Premiums awarded in any case in which it shall appear that the regulations have not been complied with or that fraud or deception has been practiced or attempted, and at the Superintendent's discretion, be excused from the ground and/or be barred from future competition at this show.
23. Department superintendents may enter exhibits in their own departments, but neither they nor any other exhibitor may communicate with the Judges during the time of determining the awards, except to answer questions proposed by the Judges.
24. It is permissible to charge an entry fee.

Animal Health Rules

The Erie County Fair at Wattsburg animal health rules are to be followed in all animal departments and contests. Appropriate documentation of necessary immunizations must be presented upon arrival at the fairgrounds for all animals. The complete requirements are listed on pages **8-11** of this Erie County Fair at Wattsburg Premium Book. ERIE COUNTY FAIR AT WATTSBURG
ANIMAL HEALTH RULES

Pennsylvania Cattle:

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued **on or after July 31, 2024.**

2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a **hand written** statement of this should be written on the CVI.

All animals being shown in market classes must have a hand written statement on the CVI that states market animals inspected and found to be properly castrated.

3. Individual official animal identification.

Official ID will have a US shield  and includes:
A USDA-issued National Uniform Eartagging System (NUES) tag; or

A 15-digit Animal Identification Number eartag starting with “840” (including RFID) or other official identification approved by PDA. (Brands and breed registrations with tattoos are not acceptable).

4. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for animals 3 months of age and older (*market cattle are exempt*).


Out of State Cattle:

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued **on or after July 31, 2024.**

2. Vesicular Stomatitis (VS): (applies to states that experienced a Vesicular Stomatitis outbreak in the last 12 months). An accredited veterinarian shall determine whether the animals are free from VS, and animals shall be accompanied by a CVI with the following statement signed by the accredited veterinarian: “All animals identified on this certificate of veterinary inspection have been examined and found to be free from VS. During the past 90 days, these animals were not located within 10 miles of a site where VS has been diagnosed.”

3. **All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a hand written statement of this must be written on the CVI.**

All animals being shown in market classes must have a hand written statement on the CVI that states market animals inspected and found to be properly castrated.

4. Individual official animal identification is required. Official ID will have a US shield  and includes:

A USDA-issued National Uniform Ear tagging System (NUES) tag; or

A 15-digit Animal Identification Number starting with “840” ear tag (including RFID) or

Other official identification approved by USDA. (Brands and breed registrations with tattoos are not acceptable).

5. Testing: Tuberculosis Requirements:
No test is required for animals originating from “Accredited Free” states or zones.

All exhibition animals originating from states or zones designated “Modified Accredited Advanced” must be test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of importation. The negative test results and date of test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (a copy of the original report is acceptable).

All animals originating from states or zones designated “Modified Accredited” must originate from herds in which all animals 12 months of age and older are test negative within the 12 months prior to the date of importation; and the individual animals to be imported (all ages) are test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of importation and at least 60 days after the negative whole herd test. The negative test results and date of test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (a copy of the original test report is acceptable).

6. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for animals 3 months of age and older (*market cattle are exempt*).

7. Negative test for Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI must be obtained for all Milking Dairy Cattle within 7 days of arrival at the fair.

Pennsylvania Equine Animals:

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued **on or after July 31, 2024.**

2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a hand written statement of this **must** be written on the CVI.

3. All equine animals must be tested negative for EIA by an official test within the 12 months prior to the opening date of the exhibition. Laboratory test results must accompany each animal to its final destination (a copy of the original lab report is acceptable). The CVI shall specify the date of sample collection, date of results, and results of the EIA test, along with the accession number and the name of the testing laboratory. Foals less than six months of age accompanied by a test-negative dam are exempt from EIA testing requirements. If the foal is not accompanied by the dam, a copy of the dam’s test results must accompany the foal to its final destination.

4. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for animals 3 months of age and older.

Out of State Equine Animals:

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued **on or after July 31, 2024.**

2. Vesicular Stomatitis (VS): (applies to states that experienced a Vesicular Stomatitis outbreak in the last 12 months). An accredited veterinarian shall determine whether the animals are free from VS, and animals shall be accompanied by a CVI with the following statement signed by the accredited veterinarian: “All animals identified on this certificate of veterinary inspection have been examined and found to be free from VS. During the past 90 days, these animals were not located within 10 miles of a site where VS has been diagnosed.”

3. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and **a hand written statement of this must be written** on the CVI. a statement of this is required on the CVI.


4. All equine animals must be tested negative for EIA by an official test within the 12 months prior to the date of importation. Laboratory test results must accompany each animal to its final destination (a copy of the original lab report is acceptable). The CVI shall specify the date of sample collection, date of results, and results of the EIA test, along with the accession number and the name of the testing laboratory. Foals less than six months of age accompanied by a test-negative dam are exempt from EIA testing requirements. If the foal is not accompanied by the dam, a copy of the dam’s test results must accompany the foal to its final destination.

5. If an equine animal has resided in Texas or New Mexico for a cumulative total of 30 days or more within the six months preceding the date of entry into the Commonwealth, that animal must be test-negative for Babesia caballi and Theileria equi on a competitive enzyme-linked immunosorbent assay (c-ELISA) test, or a department-approved equivalent test, with the test occurring within the 30 days preceding entry into Pennsylvania. The date of test and the test results shall be written on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

6. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for animals 3 months of age and older.

Pennsylvania Goats:

Individual official animal identification is required for all goats. Official ID includes:

A USDA ear tag with a US shield  ; or

A legible tattoo with herd and individual identification recognized in an approved USDA Scrapie database a.k.a. scrapie tattoo (only for herds enrolled in the USDA Voluntary Scrapie Herd Certification Program) or

A breed registration tattoo if the animal is accompanied by a registration certificate and the tattoo is legible.

A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued **on or after July 31, 2024.**

2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and **a hand written statement of this must be written on the CVI. All animals being shown in market classes must have a hand written statement on the CVI that states market animals inspected and found to be properly castrated.**

Section 11: Out of State Goats:


1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued **on or after July 31, 2024.**

2. Vesicular Stomatitis (VS): (applies to states that experienced a Vesicular Stomatitis outbreak in the last 12 months). An accredited veterinarian shall determine whether the animals are free from VS, and animals shall be accompanied by a CVI with the following statement signed by the accredited veterinarian: “All animals identified on this certificate of veterinary inspection have been examined and found to be free from VS. During the past 90 days, these animals were not located within 10 miles of a site where VS has been diagnosed.”

3. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and **a hand written statement of this must be written on the CVI.**

All animals being shown in market classes must have a hand written statement on the CVI that states market animals inspected and found to be properly castrated.

4. Individual official animal identification is required for all goats. Official ID includes:

i. A USDA ear tag with a US shield  ; or

ii. A legible tattoo with herd and individual identification recognized in an approved USDA Scrapie database a.k.a. scrapie tattoo (only for herds enrolled in the USDA Voluntary Scrapie Herd Certification Program) or

iii. A breed registration tattoo if the animal is accompanied by a registration certificate and the tattoo is legible.

5. Testing requirements: Tuberculosis:

§ No test is required for animals originating from states or zones designated as accredited-free by the USDA.

§ All animals originating from states or zones designated modified accredited advanced by the USDA must be test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of importation. The negative test results and date of test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (a copy of the original report is acceptable).

§ All animals originating from states or zones designated modified accredited must originate from herds in which all animals 12 months of age and older have tested negative within the 12 months prior to the date of importation; and the individual animals (all ages) to be imported have also tested negative within the 60 days prior to the date of importation and at least 60 days after the negative whole herd test was completed. The negative test results and date of test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (a copy of the original test report is acceptable).

Pennsylvania Rabbits:

All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases.

Out of State Rabbits:
Requirements:

No rabbits or their products, such as, meat, pelts, hides, carcasses or other items, and no equipment, exposed feed, forages, or conveyances or other items or associated materials may enter the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania from a Commonwealth, State, Territory, or Country where Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease (RHD) has been diagnosed in the prior twelve (12) months or there is a reasonable suspicion it exists unless they meet the following requirements:

(a) All live rabbits must be accompanied by an ICVI and must be examined by an accredited veterinarian within the seventy-two (72) hours prior to the date of shipment to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The ICVI must include statements by an accredited veterinarian certifying that:

(i) All rabbits in the shipment have been examined for and found free of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases;

(ii) All rabbits have originated from a single premises that has no signs of infectious, contagious or communicable disease in rabbits;

(iii) There have been no movements of rabbits onto the premises of origin within the 90 days prior to the date of shipment; and

(iv) The rabbits have had no contact with wild or captive rabbits other than their cohorts in the 90 days prior to the date of shipment.

(b) No rabbits or their products, such as, meat, pelts, hides, carcasses or other items, and no equipment, exposed feed or conveyances or other items or associated materials may enter the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania from a premises exposed to, contaminated with or known to be affected with RHD, or where there is a reasonable suspicion the disease exists or the rabbits have been exposed to or infected with RHD. Fair management has the authority to impose additional requirements designed to prevent the spread of contagious diseases.


Recommendations:

For Rabbits that originate from a from a Commonwealth, State, Territory, or Country where RHD has NOT been diagnosed in the prior twelve (12) months or there is NO reasonable suspicion it exists:

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within **72 hours prior** to the date of importation.
2. A statement on the CVI attesting that all rabbits listed on the CVI are free of signs of infectious and contagious disease.

Pennsylvania Sheep:

Individual official USDA scrapie animal identification is required for all sheep. Official scrapie ID includes:

A USDA ear tag with a US shield  ; or

A legible tattoo with herd and individual identification recognized in an approved USDA Scrapie database a.k.a. a scrapie tattoo (only for flocks enrolled in the USDA Voluntary Scrapie Flock Certification Program) or A breed registration tattoo if the animals are accompanied by a registration certificate (copy acceptable) and the tattoo is legible.

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued **on or after July 31, 2024.**

2 All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and **a hand written statement of this must be written on the CVI.**

All animals being shown in market classes must have a hand written statement on the CVI that states market animals inspected and found to be properly castrated.

3. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for animals 3 months of age and older.

Out of State Sheep:


1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued **on or after July 31, 2024.**

2. Vesicular Stomatitis (VS): (applies to states that experienced a Vesicular Stomatitis outbreak in the last 12 months). An accredited veterinarian shall determine whether the animals are free from VS, and animals shall be accompanied by a CVI with the following statement signed by the accredited veterinarian: “All animals identified on this certificate of veterinary inspection have been examined and found to be free from VS. During the past 90 days, these animals were not located within 10 miles of a site where VS has been diagnosed.”

3. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and **a hand written statement of this must be written on the CVI.**

All animals being shown in market classes must have a hand written statement on the CVI that states market animals inspected and found to be properly castrated.

4. Individual official USDA scrapie animal identification is required. Official scrapie ID includes:

A USDA ear tag with a US shield  ; or

A legible tattoo with herd and individual identification recognized in an approved USDA Scrapie database; a.k.a. A scrapie tattoo (only for flocks enrolled in USDA Voluntary Scrapie Flock Program or

A breed registration tattoo if the animals are accompanied by a registration certificate. (copy acceptable) and the tattoo is legible.

Pennsylvania Swine:

Requirements:

1. No swine species shall be exhibited in Pennsylvania unless each animal:

*Is accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI) issued **on or after July 31, 2024.**

*Is permanently identified by an official 840 series radio frequency identification (RFID) ear tag and the ear tag number is recorded on the CVI:

*Has been visually inspected and found to be free of signs of contagious disease immediately prior to unloading at the exhibition by an accredited veterinarian or swine health monitor appointed by the fair board or livestock show committee.

3. All Market swine exhibited in Department sponsored Market shows shall move directly to a PDA or USDA licensed slaughter facility following the animal exhibition and may not be diverted to premises other than a recognized slaughter establishment or a slaughter market in which the sales are designated slaughter only sales.

Out of State Swine:

Requirements:

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within **on or after July 31, 2024.** The CVI shall include a statement verifying that the swine have not been fed raw garbage.

2. Vesicular Stomatitis (VS) Statement: This applies to states that experienced a VS outbreak in the last 12 months. In these cases, an accredited veterinarian shall determine whether the animals are free from VS, and animals shall be accompanied by a CVI with the following statement signed by the accredited veterinarian: “All animals identified on this CVI have been examined and found to be free from VS. During the past 90 days, these animals were not located within 10 miles of a site where VS has been diagnosed.”

3. All animals must be free of evidence of Infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI.

4. Has been visually inspected and found to be free of signs of contagious disease immediately prior to unloading at the exhibition by an accredited veterinarian or swine health monitor appointed by the fair board or livestock show committee.

5. Individual animal ID – must be permanently identified by an official 840 series radio frequency identification (RFID) ear tag and the ear tag number is recorded on the CVI.

6. Brucellosis Testing Requirements: No test required if the animal originates from a validated brucellosis-free state or brucellosis-free herd. All others must be tested negative within the 30 days prior to the date of importation.

7. Pseudorabies Testing Requirements:

a. Sexually intact swine over 6 months of age shall originate qualified PRV negative herd or be test negative to an official pseudorabies test within 30 days prior to importation.

b. No pseudorabies testing required for all other swine.

9. All Market swine exhibited in Department sponsored Market shows shall move directly to a PDA or USDA licensed slaughter facility following the animal exhibition and may not be diverted to premises other than a recognized slaughter establishment or a slaughter market in which the sales are designated slaughter only sales.

Pennsylvania Poultry, Including Chickens, Turkeys, Waterfowl, Upland Game Birds, Ratites; and Ducks, Geese, Doves and Other Avian Species and Hatching Eggs

CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who complete in structured classes of competition.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under as affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or responsible person shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.



4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of drugs. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animals entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state, and provincial statutes, regulations, and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state, and provincial statutes, regulation and rules affect the performance or appearance at the event. If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prime facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the approved laboratory to which it is send is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was take, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise at any hearing in regard to the matter conducted by the fair or livestock show. At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal is prohibited.

6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, use electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representative, or show officials before, during or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.

9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether he or she was instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.

10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or responsible person to have any disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show against such individuals published in any publication of the IAFE, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to member.

11. The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understand the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also a violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

12. Veterinarian Consultation Relationship A relationship in which the owner or caretaker of the animal has assumed responsibility to consult a veterinarian and has agreed to follow the instructions of the veterinarian in relation to zoonotic diseases and implementing best management practices intended to reduce and prevent diseases. Your signature on the entry form confirms your compliance.

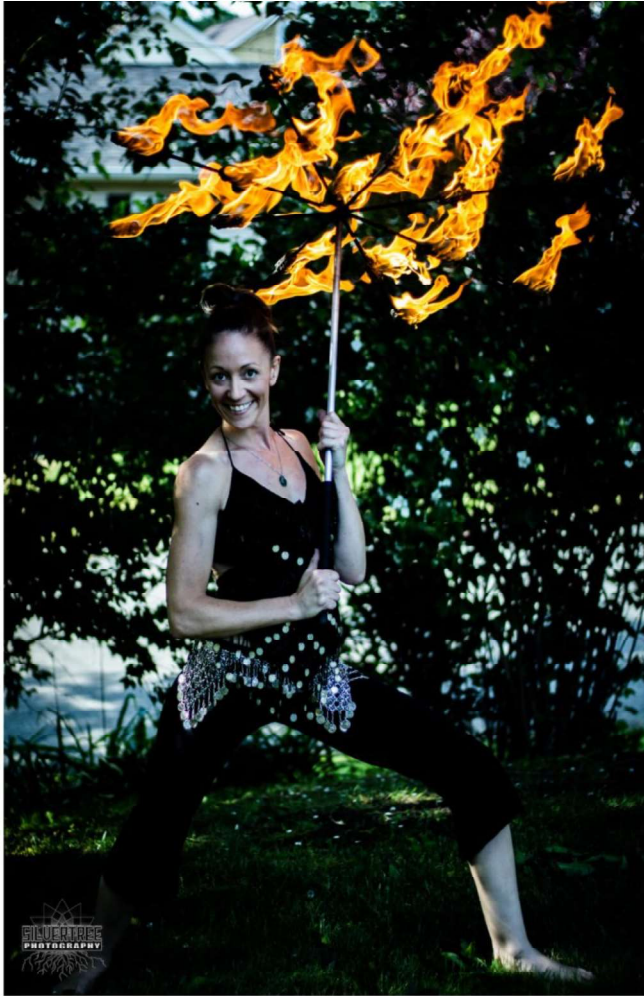

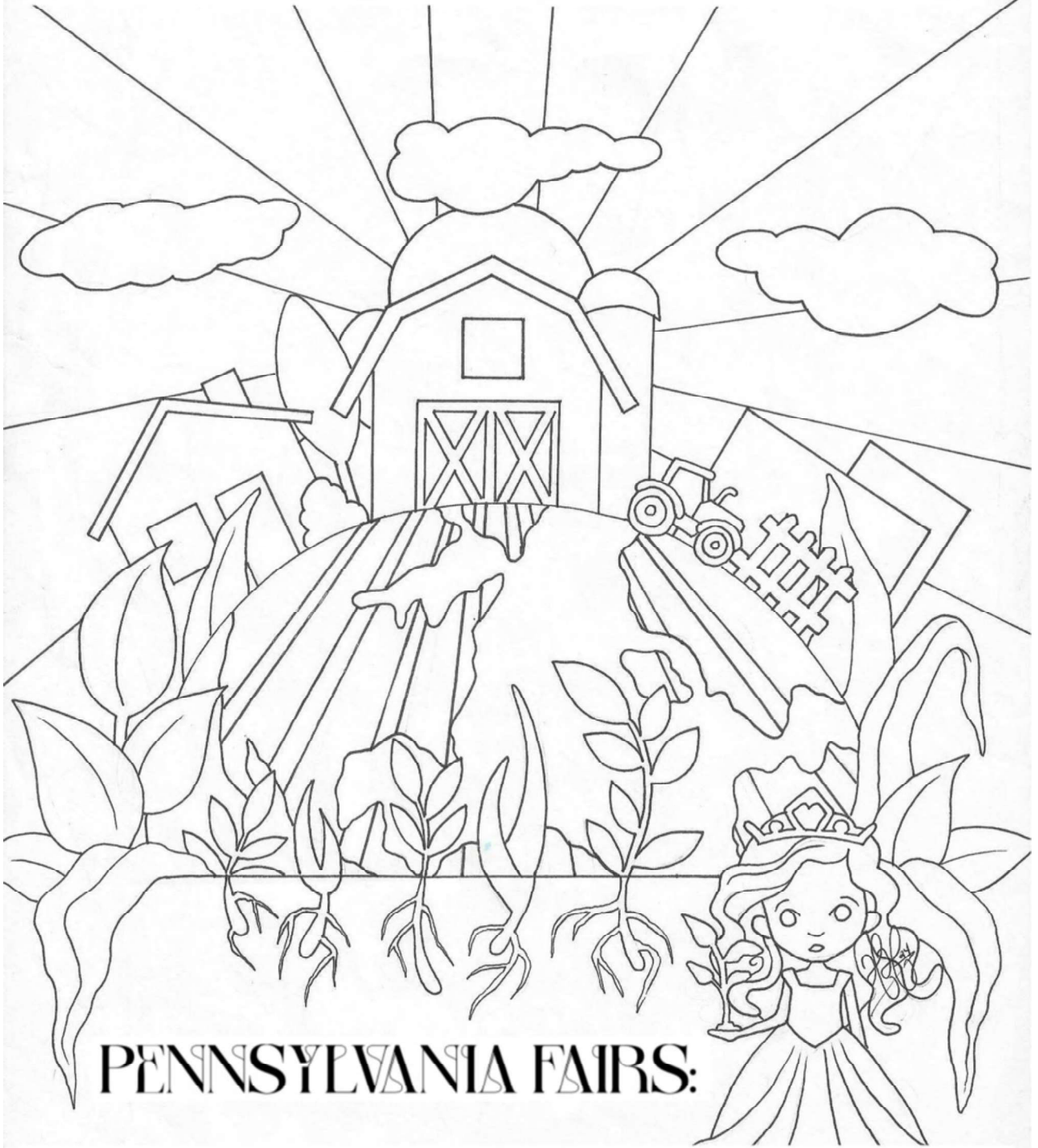

- Entries open Sunday, August 25, 2024 at 9:00 AM and close at 8:00 PM August 25, 2024. Horse must be on grounds by August 25, 2024 @ 8:00 PM. Judging starts Monday, August 26, 2024.

RULES & REGULATIONS (All General Rules Apply)

1. All entries must be on Fair Entry Forms; no additional sheets accepted. May make photo copies of Fair Entry Form.
2. Entries open Sunday, August 25, 2024 at 9:00 AM and close at 8:00 PM August 25, 2024. Animals must be on grounds by August 25, 2024 @ 8:00 PM. JUDGING BEGINS TUESDAY, August 27, 2024.
3. AN "ANIMAL Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship" form must be presented upon arrival at all shows and fairs in Pennsylvania, including out-of-state entries. (Form included at back of this Premium Book.)
4. All breeding stock must be Pure-bred animals (unless otherwise stated). any animal over six months of age must be recorded in the Registry Association for the respective breed.
5. All animals must be owned by the exhibitor 30 days prior to this show.
6. Any animal or animals entered in a person's name, other than the names or name on the Registration Certificate, shall be barred from competition and will receive no premiums.
7. The Superintendent reserves the right to bar from competition animals with decidedly inferior conformation and those not possessing sufficient merit to warrant recognition.
8. No more than two entries will be accepted for any premium.
9. Exhibitors will be expected to display or parade their animals as directed by the superintendent, to accept the stall assigned without controversy, to keep their animals in an attractive appearance and to cooperate with the Department in every way that may serve to increase the educational value of the show.
10. Exhibitors of livestock must inform themselves as to when their stock will be judged. Stock must be in the ring promptly on call and a failure to comply with the order renders exhibitors liable to be ruled out of competing. 3. the flock of origin, including sheep consigned to a show, shall be examined by an accredited veterinarian, the veterinarian must prepare the official health certificate (AAL-13) and must state on the health certificate that he examined the entire flock and found no evidence of contagious, infectious or external parasitic disease. The date of examination must also appear on the health certificate. All sheep from other states must be accompanied by an interstate health certificate issued by an accredited veterinarian indicating an examination for health within 30 days.

8. Rabbits will be accepted on Sunday August 25th from noon to 8pm. No rabbits are to be placed in the barn before noon. All rabbits must be checked in by the rabbit barn superintendent. If not checked in, they cannot be in the barn. The check in serves as a safety measure and also ensures they are placed into their assigned coops.
9. You are required to stay until the check in process is complete because any rabbits showing signs of parasites or sickness will be sent back home with you.

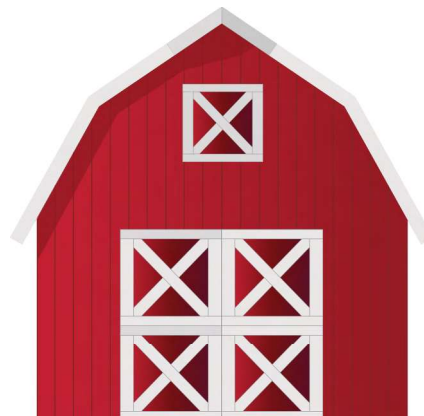

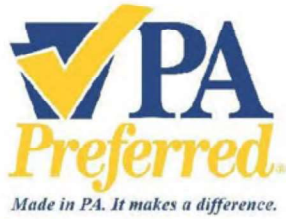
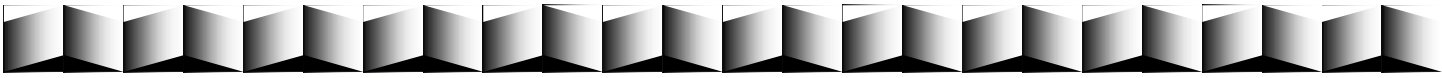

2024 PA Preferred® Junior Baking Contest Cookies, Brownies and Bars

The goal of the PA Preferred® Baking Contest is to encourage young people across the Commonwealth to participate in Pennsylvania’s agricultural fairs by showcasing Pennsylvania grown and produced products in their contest entries.

RULES:

1. Open to any individual **amateur** baker (ages 8 through 18 at the time of the fair’s contest) who is a Pennsylvania resident. One entry per person.
2. **Entrants may NOT have won 1st place in this PA Preferred® Junior Baking contest at any other fair in 2024.**
3. Entry must be **six (6) individual sized portions** of the baked entry item (cookies, brownies or bars).
4. The Cookies, Brownies or Bars, and any fillings and frostings, must be **made from scratch with edible ingredients**. No pre-packaged ingredients may be used (*ex: no pre-made mixes, cookie dough, pie crust, frosting, etc.*). Any decorations must just be edible.
5. At least two (2) PA Preferred® or locally produced ingredients must be used in the recipe. Some examples of qualifying ingredients include grains (*such as oats or flour*), butter, milk, eggs, fruits and/or vegetables.
6. **A PA Preferred® logo is not required** because not all PA Preferred® products carry the label. The name of the ingredient and the source is sufficient (*see attached example*). Contact RA-AGPAPreferred@pa.gov for any assistance with qualifying ingredients.
7. Entry must be submitted for judging **on a food safe disposable setting**. (*All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.*)
8. Recipe(s) must be submitted with the entry, printed on one side of 8-1/2" x 11" sheets of paper. Recipe must list all ingredients, quantities, and the preparation instructions. **The name of each PA Preferred® ingredient or locally produced ingredient must be clearly listed along with the name of the source that made/grew the product** (*ex: PA Preferred Milk – Galliker’s brand or Apples - Smith Farm Orchard*). Entrant’s name, age, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages. (*All recipes and cookies-brownies-bars will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.*)
9. Refrigeration is not available at the fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.

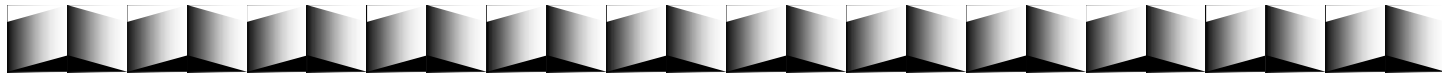

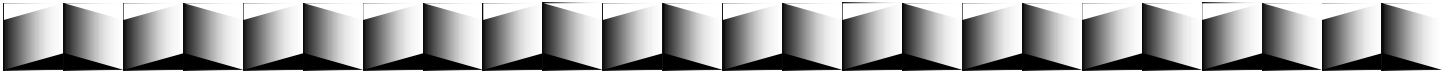

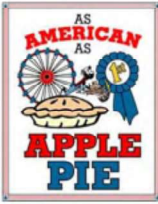

Each county/local fair is encouraged to conduct a 36th Annual Blue Ribbon Apple Pie Contest at their 2024 event. Listed below are the criteria which we would like each fair to use in their contest. The certified first place winner from each fair will then have the opportunity to enter an apple pie in the BLUE RIBBON APPLE PIE CONTEST at the 2025 PENNSYLVANIA FARM SHOW.

RULES for local Fair and the PA Farm Show contests are as follows:

1. Open to any individual amateur baker who is a Pennsylvania resident. One entry per person.
2. Entrants may **NOT** have won 1st place in this Blue Ribbon Apple Pie contest at any other fair in 2024.
3. The Apple Pie, including fillings and crust, must be made from scratch with edible ingredients. No pre-packaged ingredients may be used (ex: no pre-made mixes, cookie dough, pie crust, frosting, etc.) Any decorations must just be edible.
4. Recipe must include at least 60% apples in the filling. It does not need to be a “traditional” two crusted apple pie and it can have a variety of fillings.
5. The entire pie must be submitted for judging in a food safe disposable pie pan. (All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.)
6. The recipe for the pie and pie crust must be submitted with the entry. It should be submitted on one side of 8 ½” by 11” sheets of paper. The recipe must list all the ingredients, quantities, and the preparation instructions. Entrant’s name, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages. (All recipes and pies will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.)
7. Refrigeration is not available at the Fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.
8. Judging will be based on the following criteria:

Flavor	30 points
Filling: consistency, doneness, moistness & flavor	25 points
Crust: color, flavor, texture doneness	20 points
Overall Appearance	15 points
Creativity	<u>10 points</u>
TOTAL	100 Points

Creativity is essential to a varied competition. Do not limit your contest to a “traditional” two-crust apple pie. We are looking for a variety of fillings in the pies; the pie must include at least 60% apples in the filling.

Each Fair must submit the Contest Summary Report verifying the winning apple pie baker. This person will then be eligible to enter the state competition at the 2025 PA Farm Show and will receive the Official PA Farm Show Certification Entry Form directly from the PA Fairs Special Baking Contest Committee by December 2.

NOTE: If an individual has already won 1st place at another fair in 2024 for this Blue Ribbon Apple Pie contest, that individual is now considered qualified through that Fair to compete at the 2025 PA Farm Show and is no longer eligible to enter this contest at any upcoming Fairs.

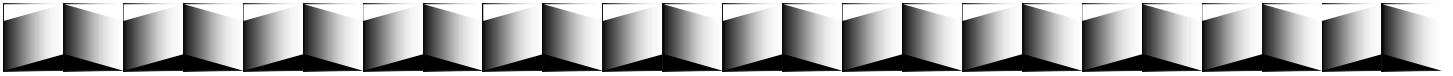

3. The Cake and any Fillings and Frostings must be **made from scratch with edible ingredients**. No pre-packaged ingredients may be used (*ex: no pre-made mixes, cookie dough, pie crust, frosting, etc.*).
Any decorations must just be edible.
4. The recipe shall include eggs that were produced in Pennsylvania, if possible.
5. The entire cake entry must be submitted for judging **on cardboard or other food safe disposable setting**. (*All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.*)
6. Recipe(s) listing the ingredients and the preparation instructions must be submitted with the entry (*printed on one-side of 8-1/2" x 11" size sheets of paper*). Entrant's name, address and phone number must be printed on the back of all the pages. (*All recipes and cakes will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.*)
7. Refrigeration is NOT available at the Fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned, or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.
8. Judging will be based on the following criteria:

Flavor (smell, taste, flavoring)	30 points
Inside Characteristics (texture & lightness)	25 points
Overall Appearance (surface, size, color)	20 points
Creativity	15 points
Topping, Icing or Decoration	10 points

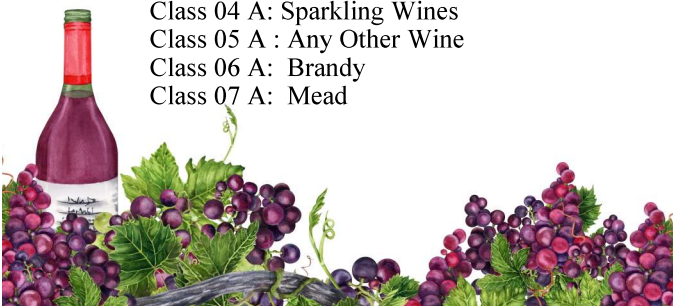

FARM STOCK TRACTOR RULES

- No consumption of alcoholic beverages or narcotics in tractor pit area. Failure to observe rules will result in removal from track or pit area with no refund of entry fee, also will be barred from pulling with this organization for one full year.
- All contestants must be 12 years of age with written parental consent through age 18. All drivers must wear shoes that completely cover the foot (no sandals), shirt, long pants, and helmet before they are permitted to compete.
- Judges have the right to re-weigh or re-tech any tractor anytime during or after the pull.
- All engine fans must be shrouded with factory shroud or minimum of 1/16" thick steel.
- No weight may extend more than 24" beyond the most forward point of the tractor.
- The tractor tires must remain in the boundaries of the contest course.
- Minimum draw bar length of 18" from the center of the rear axle to the point of hook. Draw bar must be stationary in all directions. Maximum height of 20" from top of hitching device parallel to the ground. Clevis to be measured to the center.

- Draw bar to be equipped with steel hitching device not more than 1.5" thick and a 3" diameter opening. Cross sectional thickness must be measured 7/8" minimum to 1.5" maximum. Pulling point must not be more than 1.5" from back edge of the pulling device.
- No pressurized tanks unless UL approved. No nitrous oxide, or propane.
- All tractors must compete using the fuel tractor was intended by the factory.
- All tractors competing must run under a working governor. All throttle stops must be permanent, no vice grips or other temporary fixtures/rigging.
- No portion of the tractor may interfere with any portion of the sled or the sled hitching device during the pull. this includes weights. Hooking and unhook of tractor must have EASY, CLEAR access.
- All weights must be secured to the tractor (no tarp straps). No weights permitted on the seat or deck, this includes cab tractors. Any ballast or external parts lost while hooded to the sled will be cause for disqualification of that class, excludes internal parts.
- All tractors must be equipped with workable rear brakes. use of torque converters, power shifts, etc. is permitted.
- Contestant has 50 feet to the front of the tractor to decide on change of gear, one restart per class. No restart permitted in a pull off.
- Driver must be in total control of the tractor wheel at all times while pulling and operate in a safe manner or be disqualified at the discretion of the flag person.
- Tractor must be stopped upon signal from either track official. Pull is considered over when forward motion of the sled stops, no hole digging allowed.
- All tractors must be in neutral or park transmission selector while being hooked and unhooked.
- The number one puller will be the test puller, and may take the pull if the working condition of the weight machine is satisfactory. Driver will have the option to take the pull or drop to the sixth pulling position. All decisions on re-pulls must be made before the tractor leaves the track. In the event the weight transfer is changed there is no option to drop.
- Each contestant may spot the sled for their pull. Contestants must notify track official or sled operator before the sled is backed into start position.
- All contestants must pull in position drawn within 3 minutes of sled spotting or will be disqualified. Track officials must be notified of any delays, and then the contestant may become last puller.
- All pulls must start with a tight hitch, no jerking.
- Violation of any rule will result in automatic disqualification. Tack official has the right to stop and disqualify any tractor at any time,. Disqualification for any tech reason during a pulling event will lose all points and moneys for that event.
- Registration closes at the start of the first class, unless due to traffic conditions. Judges decision to be final.
- No bracing above center of the rear axle unless cradled, except complete factory setup.
- All classes must have a hood, grill, and fenders.
- A pace tractor may be used operating at 3 mph.
- There will be a 3000 rpm limit on all classes.

- No consumption of alcoholic beverages in the track or pit area. Anyone believed to be a potential safety hazard will be barred. Failure to observe the rules will result in the removal from the track or pit area with no refund or entry fee.

 - Maximum height of 25" from ground to SOLID POINT of hook-up, not using a clevis. Puller must supply a 3 inch clevis of their own.
 - Hitch bracing not to exceed 25" from hitch forward or under vehicle.
 - No under bed or over bed hook-ups permitted.
- Weights, stock and open classes.
 - Weights are permitted in bed or cargo area if tailgate is in place.
 - No front mounted weights in street class, also no weights hanging anywhere on the vehicle.
- Engine 5,500 & 7,000 stock classes.
 - Engine to be stock as from factory, no intake or exhaust changes. Dual exhaust allowed. No headers, air filters such as (K&N) set ups will ruled on by track officials.

B. Updated carburetors will be allowed, but no spacer plates and no manifold changes.

C. Ignition components must be of factory replacement. No MSD, Accel Coils or Dual Point Ignition in stock classes.

D. Fuel pump gas ONLY, all forms of nitrous are illegal as fuel or additives. Electrical fuel pumps permitted. Diesel fuel on in diesel class. No propane enhancements or injectors.

- Drive line to be basically stock and remain in position as intended by factory.
- SUSPENSION: No solid blocking between frame and axle, no solid suspensions, no traction bars and no lift kits.
- AXLES- No welded or spooled front or rear axles. Vehicles must be able to drive ON and OFF the track without stopping to lock or unlock front or rear axles so you can turn.
- Any changes of pulling vehicles from manufacturers original intention will move your vehicle to open classes.
- 5,800 and 6,800 Open Gas Classes: Open classes were made for vehicles that have some sort of modification to them.
 - Engine must run on pump fuel. No nitrous or enhancement fueling.
 - Headers will be allowed and can open.
 - Traction bars will be allowed in open.
 - Axles may have lockers or posy traction, but not be welded or spooled. Vehicle must be able to turn ON and OFF from the track with no help from an outside person.
- All trucks must pull forward.
- All trucks must enter and leave the track under their own power.
- All pulls must start with a tight hitch, no jerking permitted.

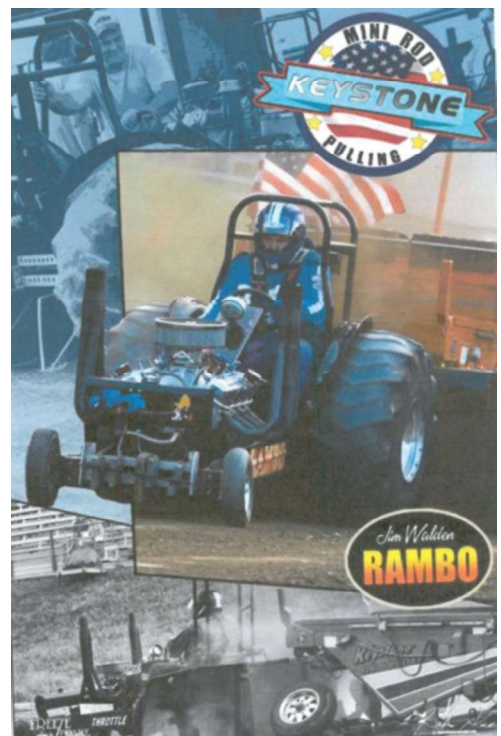

The Erie County Fair at Wattsburg animal health rules are to be followed in all animal departments and contests. Appropriate documentation of necessary immunizations must be presented upon arrival at the fairgrounds for all animals. The complete requirements are listed in the front of the Erie County Fair at Wattsburg Premium Book.

- There will be two (2) classes: 3,425 pounds and under and 3,426 pounds and up.
- Distance to pull is 27.5 feet.
- Twenty (20) foot foul lines: on/over these lines disqualified pull; counts as a pull with no distance.
- Three (3) passes to the sled constitutes one (1) pull.
 - First and second pull to be direction of judges.
 - Unhitch or fail to hitch; pass on second pull.
 - Third pull will be driver's choice of direction, providing there is enough room to do the distance (full distance).
- Teams to pull in rotation.
- Drivers are allowed two hitchers. They are not allowed to touch or speak to the horses while they are in motion. they must also stay behind point of hitch when horses are drawing.
- Driver will ride the sled in a sitting position.
- Horses will not be headed throughout contest; if it occurs the driver must unhitch and make another pass.
- A whistle will be blown when the team has made the full distance or when forward motion of the sled stops.
- There will be no whipping, slapping or foul language.
- Any breakage of harness or equipment, the team is entitled to another pull if desired.
- No additional entries after the 2nd weight has been added. Added weight is after first draw.
- Judges decisions are final.
- All teams must stay in the pulling area until class is over or the department head of the pull gives permission to leave.
- All horses are subject to blood test after pull.
- A Coggins Test will be required showing negative test within last 12 months. No horses showing clinical signs of contagious or infectious disease will be permitted.
